Two fall internships are currently available at Sheep Pasture for September – December, 2010. Internships are open to college students currently interested in or pursuing studies in environmental education, early elementary, elementary or secondary education, and/or the natural sciences.

Interns will work on a variety of learning projects at Sheep Pasture, including, but not limited to: educational program planning, interaction with visitors, assisting the teacher/ naturalists with programs, working with children enrolled in summer programs. Opportunities for conducting individual natural science research projects at Sheep Pasture may also be available, with approval.

Date and hours: The program will run from September, 2010 until December, 2010. Weekly hours are expected for the duration of the program; specific times will be determined on an individual basis. Internships are unpaid, but may be used for course credit, at the discretion of the intern's college. NRT does not offer or guarantee college credit for this experience. **Interns are responsible for approving necessary requirements for credit with their own college or institution for this experience.**

Qualifications: Interns must have completed at least 1 full year of college study in a major related to environmental science, natural science, education, or similar. Interns must commit to completion of the entire internship experience, as outlined. CORI/SORI background investigations will be completed for all accepted interns.

Applications: Individuals who are interested in applying for a possible internship at Sheep Pasture should submit a letter of interest, resume, three letters of recommendation, and a copy of college transcripts to:
